

Sports Premium Report (2018/19)

For the year 2018-2019, St Weonards Primary School was allocated £16,000 Sports Premium funding. This was allocated as follows:

Employment of PE Specialist teachers Employment of PE Specialist teachers to deliver after school sports clubs	To ensure that pupils receive high quality tuition across the curriculum whilst working with school teaching staff. To enable participation in KS2 dance programme and performance at Courtyard Theatre. To ensure <i>all</i> children are given the same opportunities to access a variety of sports activities.	All pupils have benefitted from specialist sports teaching. They have been taught a wide range of different sports which they have thoroughly enjoyed. Staff have grown in confidence when teaching PE lessons and deliver lessons with enthusiasm. The children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 worked with a dance specialist to choreograph and perform their own dance at The Courtyard. Their dance was fantastic and they were very proud of their achievement. All children have access to a variety of after school sports clubs. These clubs are available to KS1 and KS2 and are highly participated in. Children are taught different sports skills which they can use when participating in sporting events.	£5086	Continue to employ same specialists to ensure continuity. Also employ a new specialist to add extra opportunities for the children.
Employment of swimming instructors	To ensure that pupils receive high quality swimming teaching with qualified instructors working alongside school teaching staff, with an aim to all Y6 pupils achieving the NC expectation.	All of the children in the school had swimming lessons this year. The children were engaged in lessons and many children achieved their badges. 50% of pupils (3 out of 6) achieved the expected standard at the end of KS2.	£1869	Continue to fund the employment of swimming coaches.
Purchase of new PE equipment	To ensure that all PE activities are appropriately resourced.	Children have been able to participate in a wider range of sporting activities this year due to new equipment being purchased. This has included a lacrosse set and outdoor equipment for EYFS to improve their physical development skills.	£2248	Continue to resource PE equipment to enable access to a wider range of activities.
Hire of transport to enable access to sporting events and swimming sessions	To ensure that pupils are able to participate in sporting competitions and activities because of the rural nature of the school.	Pupils have taken part in a range of sporting activities, both competitive and non-competitive. There have been netball, tag rugby, rounders and athletics tournaments. All of these have contributed to the HMFA league. There has also been a multi skills festival which has been non-competitive and given children a chance to learn new skills.	£4130	Continue with transport hire.
Supply cover to release a teacher to enable participation in matches, federation activities and outdoor pursuits	The children have the opportunity to take part in a wide range of activities but require adult supervision by a suitably qualified and trained person.	See above.	£725	Continue to enable staff to be released to take children to sporting activities.
