Tapestry Challenges!



- Go on a coin hunt and collect all the loose coins in your house. Can you sort them out into different types and learn how much they are worth? Can you make a shop with your toys and practice buying things with the coins?
- Can you create a number line? Have a go at writing your numbers all the way to 20.
- Can you go on a shape hunt? What shapes can you find? Have you found any 2D or 3D shapes?
- Can you roll a dice twice and add or subtract the numbers? Have a go at recording your number sentences.
- Have a go at solving problems involving doubling and halving. Can you use objects in your house to double or half?
- Can you draw the numbers on a clock face?




- Get the adult in your house to find photos of when they were little. How have people changed? What is different when your adult was younger to now?
- Complete a science experiment at home. What is your prediction? What happened? You could try planting seeds in different places - which one do you think will grow best?
- Can you help your adult make a meal or a cake? Have a go at following a recipe. Can you talk about the foods that are healthy and the food that are unhealthy?
- Can you play a game with the people in your house? Make sure you take it in turns!



- Can you write a shopping list?
- Can you write a sentence about your day?
- Listen to a grown up read you our class story of Jack and the Beanstalk. (PDF available on tapestry if you do not have your own copy)
- Can you write a speech bubble from a character of a story you have read?
- Can you make a card for one of your family members?
- Jack and the beanstalk is a quest story, can you have a go at creating a story map to go with your own quest story?
- Can you write a letter to your friend?
- Have a go at writing the alphabet- make sure you start your letters in the right place and try to use our school writing.

- Complete a 5-minute activity each day for a week (1 minute for each activity; counting star jumps, shuttle runs, hops, skipping).
- Go on GoNoodle.com and learn some more dance routines. We love banana, banana meatball and superheroes unite!
- Can you create an obstacle course? Time yourselves and your family. Who managed to complete the course the quickest? Take a photo of your obstacle course.
- Can you create a game that one or two people can play?
