### English

In English, we will be learning the stories The Little Red Hen and The Hungry Caterpillar using Talk 4 Writing to add actions and memorise the text. This will then enable the children to be confident enough to change some aspects of the story to create a new version. We will be looking at spelling the days of the week and time related words, e.g. first, next, then. The children will also have opportunities for some instruction writing.

### Mathematics

In Mathematics the children will be securing their number and place value knowledge, building on what they have already learned in the previous year. This will embed the firm foundations to use number in calculation strategies next term. Children will also explore measure by completing tasks to do with length & height and weight & capacity.

### Science

In Science, we will look closely and learn about the four seasons and how they change, including the different types of weather and daylight hours. We will also be looking into how humans change over time, what is needed to stay healthy and grow, and finally identifying and naming parts of the body.

#### Art/ Design Technology

In Art we will be looking at the artist
Damien Hurst and how people can be
captured through different Art
techniques. Pupils will also learn about
where our food comes from and have a go
at making a healthy wrap using the food
groups and tasting homemade bread.

### Computing

The children will become confident at logging on and be aware of computer and internet safety with the knowledge of when to tell an adult.

### PSHE

Our focus this term will be on 'Being me in my World' and 'Celebrating Differences'. We'll be identifying our positive qualities and what it means to be in a team and part of a class.

# Religious Education

Our focus this term in R.E is all about the Creation Story and who Christians say made the world. We will also explore what it means to belong to a faith or community and how this can be expressed. Other opportunities to celebrate religious Christian festivals include Harvest and Christmas.

### Physical Education

This term in P.E the children are looking at throwing and catching skills. We are looking at under and over arm throws as well as special awareness. With our PE specialist they are looking at how to attack, shoot and defend in team sports. We will also be swimming every week with a qualified instructor.
